

(Head of Akshardham Project) For quite some time, His Holiness Pramukh Swami Maharaj had envisioned of building an Akshardham in North America. In 1997, he finally voiced this desire to the devotees and encouraged them to begin the process of finding suitable land. Initially, Dr K.C. Patel and Board Members began this

earnest search, which was later continued by a team of youths including Bharatbhai, Dipal, Hari, Sunil and Yogesh under the guidance and supervision of Pujya Yagnavallabh Swami and Kanubhai, CEO of BAPS North America. Based on Swamishri's guidance of finding a substantial area of land, they scouted for land in all directions, visiting many locations.

Finally, after a long search, a location was found in Robbinsville, New Jersey. At that time, in 2007, Swamishri was in America. When Swamishri was informed about the site, he instructed the devotees to proceed with the acquisition of the land provided the Township and the neighbours were supportive of the project. Thereafter, efforts were launched to procure the land. Prior to his departure from the US, since the legal proceedings were ongoing, Swamishri decided not to visit the site then, but would come in the future after it was acquired. Thus Swamishri's visit was postponed. Shortly thereafter, due to the grace of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Swamishri, we acquired 102 acres and later on, an adjacent plot of 65 acres. Upon hearing such news, Swamishri responded, "It is good we have got the land. I had not been able to come,

but I want to." This was the first of many times Swamishri conveyed his desire to visit the Akshardham site.

Meanwhile, the arduous task of designing the entire Akshardham complex began. When Swamishri was shown the overall site plan, he expressed that the *shikharbaddh* mandir should be made completely out of marble, just as Shastriji Maharaj had made one in Gadhada. Not only this, but he said the mandir should last for over 1000 years! To fulfil his wish, stone testing was performed on marble. Experts proposed to Swamishri to have the mandir enclosed inside a building so that it could be protected from the harsh climate changes in the northeast region of America. Swamishri gave his blessings to build the mandir within such a structure.

The mandir is ornately designed and made in alignment with the Hindu shastras. The mandir plans were drafted by a Sompura (traditional architect) and sadhus. Then, the stones were carved according to the designs and plans through the immense efforts of Harshadbhai Chavda, who runs a stone workshop in Pindvada, Rajasthan. The design for the *shikharbaddh* mandir was done by Prakashbhai Sompura (architect), Bhaktinandan Swami, Shrijiswarup Swami, Aksharvatsal Swami and others. Shri B.V. Chaudhary (New Delhi) and Ashwinbhai Patel (Ahmedabad) also provided their expert services as structural and civil engineers respectively.

The mandir was to be made out of Italian marble. To ensure the quality of the marble was suitable for the mandir, Pujya Muniraj Swami travelled to the quarries in Italy from time to time. The selected marble was then shipped to India and arrived in Pindvada,

where it was shaped and sculpted by artisans according to various designs. Once carved, it was shipped to America and the mandir construction process began at the hands of Indian artisans and BAPS volunteers. Rohitbhai Patel of Sachi Construction and his team aided in the construction of the mandir, which had to conform to the American codes and conditions. In just over three years the entire mandir was ready, and enclosed within a building. Large skylights were installed on top of the building to allow natural light to flow in to enhance the beauty of the mandir exterior. Pujya Bhaktinandan Swami, Harshadbhai, and many sadhus and devotees made great efforts to finish the monumental task.

Throughout the entire construction process, Swamishri frequently shared his wish to go to the *murti-pratishtha* in Robbinsville. However, as time passed his health declined, making everyone believe there would be no chance for him to go. Furthermore, in the last two years, since Swamishri could not travel about (even in Gujarat), everyone believed that going to America was out of the question. The doctors, too, had refused. Despite these physical setbacks, Swamishri once more expressed his wish of going to the US to Pujya Yagnavallabh Swami and Kanubhai during their visits to India in 2014. Understanding his inner wish, we sought the advice of doctors once again to see if such a trip could actually happen. Dr Tejas Patel (Ahmedabad) declared that Swamishri's health was fine and that there would be no problem in taking him. When Swamishri was notified, he replied, "Let us go. With such a big event we should go." Thus, arrangements for Swamishri's visit to the US commenced.

On 5 August 2014, Swamishri left on a chartered flight from India. He arrived at 12.55 a.m. to the Akshardham complex and mandir in Robbinsville on 6 August 2014. At that time, many devotees welcomed Swamishri with tears of joy. No one believed it to be possible for Swamishri to come.

Thereafter, everyone felt that because of the long flight and jet lag, Swamishri would rest for the initial two days. But, to everyone's surprise, Swamishri came out the next day to see the Akshardham site. For two hours, he visited each and every corner of the campus. Swamishri was very pleased to see the land and the tree line that surrounded the entire site, giving it an ambience of serenity and peace. He felt that the site was most appropriate and Akshardham would turn out to be magnificent.

On 9 and 10 August, the murti-pratishtha was celebrated festively in Swamishri's

presence. Prior to Swamishri's arrival in America, a *mahayagna* was performed as part of the Mandir inauguration ceremony. Six sessions were arranged to accommodate all the devotees who had registered for the *yagna* rituals. On 10 August, Swamishri entered the *garbhagruha* (sanctum sanctorum) of the mandir and personally performed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals. Swamishri blessed all with divine memories.

It is impossible to adequately describe the beauty of the *shikharbaddh* mandir. One never tires in seeing the mandir. When Swamishri saw the mandir for the first time, he was very pleased. He saw the entire mandir for at least two hours and said the stone work and carvings were very beautiful. Later, thousands of devotees and local visitors were amazed and thrilled to see the elaborate carvings. Many visitors were left speechless by the unique construction and design of the mandir and the enclosure.

Swamishri stayed for a total of twelve days during Mandir Mahotsav. Many devotees took the opportunity to have his darshan and participate in the Mandir Mahotsav. Swamishri gave darshan to all twice every day – from either the outdoor stage or inside on the Satsang Activity Centre stage. He showered his bliss upon all.

During the Mandir Mahotsav there were hundreds of volunteers who offered their *seva*. Many of them, children, teenagers and youths, had been engaged in the preparations for the past few months. They all served energetically in various departments including, *sabha* arrangements, kitchen, stage programmes, parking, housekeeping, security, Shayona, Aksharpith, transportation, accounting, mandir tour guides, public flow, guest relations, decoration, audio-visual and other departments, regardless of day or night. One becomes humbled by their tireless and passionate *seva*. They had disregarded their physical body to do rigorous *seva*. The reason was the joy they had experienced on Swamishri's arrival and stay. The darshan of Swamishri charged everyone for their various *sevas*. The devotees truly served with body, mind and wealth.

Prior to Swamishri's visit, the foundation-stone-laying ceremony of Akshardham Mahamandir had already been performed on 31 August 2011, with the foundation being laid on 26 October 2013. Despite this, everyone wished that Swamishri himself bless the land on which the Akshardham Mahamandir will be built. Thus, when Swamishri arrived to the US, he fulfilled the wishes of the devotees and touched the land. He sat on the main proposed *garbhagruha* area of Akshardham Mahamandir and placed the *nidhikumbh*.

The Akshardham Mahamandir, yet to be built, has a unique design. Swamishri has seen the designs quite often and has given his suggestions and corrections.

The Akshardham Mahamandir will be made of stone from Bulgaria and Greece. As part of his *seva*, Vinodbhai is currently staying and travelling between Greece and Bulgaria to dispatch stones to Pindvada, Rajasthan, where the sculpting of stones has already begun. In the next several years the Akshardham complex will be ready.

INTRODUCTION

In 1970, Yogiji Maharaj had prophesied and blessed Dr K. C. Patel, who later served as President of BAPS in North America, "Pramukh Swami will come to America and consecrate a mandir opposite your house, and he will inspire the satsang manifold." Today, BAPS in North America has six shikharbaddh mandirs, 89 hari mandirs, 70 sadhus and a following of thousands of devotees. The blessings of Yogiji Maharaj and the colossal efforts of Pramukh Swami Maharaj in the past four decades have seen the development of a vibrant BAPS satsang in many parts of North America. In 1997, Swamishri declared his wish to construct a Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex in North America. The epic story of how the project's first two phases began and developed reflects the profound bhakti and efforts of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, his sadhus and devotees.

The Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex in North America is to be built in five main phases. They are as follows:

- 1. Phase 1: Satsang Activity Centre this includes a large assembly hall for discourses, kitchen and dining areas, gymnasium for youths, and classrooms for cultural and religious education.
- 2. Phase 2: Shikharbaddh Mandir and Sant Ashram the enclosed *shikharbaddh* mandir will also have an area where *abhishek* rituals of Shri Nilkanth Varni will take place. The *sant* ashram is adjacent to the mandir allowing sadhus easy access to the mandir.
- 3. Phase 3: Youth Centre a dedicated area for children and youth activities to learn more about satsang and living a morally pure life. Classrooms, gymnasium and auditorium will fill this area.
- 4. Phase 4: Welcome Centre this will include a reception facility, auditorium,
- Swaminarayan Aksharpith/souvenir shop, Shayona restaurant/food shop and the headquarters of BAPS North America Satsang.
- 5 Phase 5: Akshardham Mahamandir accompanying the magnificent Akshardham Mahamandir will be a grand *parikrama*, ornate landscapes and gardens and inspiring exhibition halls.

A brief description of the series of events leading to the Mandir Mahotsav in Robbinsville, New Jersey, is as follows.

TIMELINE

1997. On 8 December, in Atladra, Swamishri expressed his wish to build an Akshardham in North America to the *sadguru* sadhus and senior devotees.

1998. After his heart bypass surgery in New York, Swamishri visited prospective sites for Akshardham in New Jersey.

2004. Swamishri wrote a letter from New Delhi to the US conveying his blessings for the making of Akshardham in North America.

2005. Swamishri was at the Akshar-Purushottam Chhatralaya in Vallabh Vidyanagar engaged in a discussion about Akshardham. He expressed his blessings for the project.

Later in the year, Swamishri wrote a letter blessing the *bal-kishore mandals* of northeast America to offer their services in the Akshardham project.

2006. In Mahelav, before the *murti* of Shastriji Maharaj, Swamishri prayed for the creation of Akshardham in North America.

2007. From 1998 to 2007 senior BAPS devotees and volunteers visited 246 sites for the Akshardham project. Out of them all, a site in East Windsor, New Jersey, was found to be suitable. But upon submitting applications to build the complex, the governing body chose not to grant permission. The search continued elsewhere.

2007. Seeing the assembly hall totally full, with many devotees standing outside, during the Jal Jhilani celebration at the mandir in Edison, New Jersey, Swamishri happily alluded to the need for a bigger mandir, "Even I feel that something has

to be done."

Before departing from the US Swamishri gave his approval, instructing the Board Members to acquire the 102-acre land in Robbinsville, New Jersey. Swamishri had expressed his wish to visit the site at Robbinsville before his departure to India, but due to ongoing legal proceedings, it did not materialize at that time. Thereafter, on many occasions, he reminded Pujya Yagnavallabh Swami and Kanubhai Patel about not having been able to visit the site.

2008. The site for the Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex in Robbinsville, New Jersey, was acquired by BAPS. Thereafter, an application for the approval of plans was submitted to the Robbinsville Township authorities. On 22 October, members of the Robbinsville Township Planning Board, the governing body who determines whether a given project should be approved or not, took up the application for discussion. To ensure all questions were proactively addressed, a thorough presentation was prepared by BAPS volunteers in conjunction with their consultant team. The in-depth presentation took two meetings. During the second meeting, the Board was convinced and gave its permission on 29 October 2008 for the construction of the Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex.

2009. Bhumi Pujan of Land

On 14 February in Delhi, Swamishri endorsed and blessed the preliminary design of Akshardham Mahamandir. On 7 July, the *bhumi pujan* rituals were performed on the site by sadhus and leading

devotees from across North America.

In November, the site work for the first phase commenced. Thereafter, as the site work progressed Swamishri conveyed his blessings. 2010. Planning Permission for Mahamandir

On 17 February, BAPS applied for the final design approval of the Akshardham Mahamandir and the *parikrama* (i.e. final phase of the project) to the Township Planning Board. Once again, to provide in-depth information to the Board and neighbours, the BAPS volunteer team along with the consultants spoke over two meetings to address all potential questions and concerns. The Planning Board was satisfied and declared its permission on 24 February 2010. As soon as the approval was granted, Swamishri, who was in Gandhinagar at the time, received a call from Kanubhai, notifying him of the events that had transpired that day. Swamishri was immensely pleased to hear the joyous news and expressed his blessings.

2010. Shikharbaddh Mandir Shila Pujan

On 12 July (V.S. 2066, Ashadh *sud* 1), in New Delhi, Swamishri performed the *shila pujan* rituals for the foundation-stone-laying of the Robbinsville *shikharbaddh* mandir. Swamishri also showered flower petals on the plans for the Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex and sanctified them. Simultaneously, planning and preparations for the *shilanyas* ceremony were under way in New Jersey. **2010. Shikharbaddh Mandir Shila Pujan**

On 21 August (Shravan *sud* 13), the *shilanyas* or foundation-stone-laying ceremony for the *shikharbaddh* mandir in Robbinsville commenced at 9.00 a.m. with the *mahapuja* rituals in the presence of Pujya Dr Swami. Dr Swami, sadhus and leading devotees performed the *shilanyas* rituals in the foundation pit while thousands of devotees participated in the rituals in a large adjacent marquee. Later, the devotees filled the *nidhikumbh* to be placed in the mandir foundation with currency coins of 60 countries. Finally, each devotee placed a brick, on which they had written 'Swaminarayan' along with their own name, in the foundation pit.

To include all the devotees who had enrolled for the *shilanyas* rituals, four sessions were held over 21 and 22 August. During the *shilanyas* assembly, Richard Levesque, then vice-president of Robbinsville Township Council, shared his sentiments, "The feeling of community, the feeling of family when I walked into the ceremony today was just amazing. That community and family aspect which BAPS brings to our community is second-to-none."

Every year, from December to March, the northeast region of USA faces a severe winter season. At the Robbinsville site the heavy snow showers and sub-zero winds almost paralysed the construction work. The rains between April and November also hindered the construction work. Thus the construction pace of the *shikharbaddh* mandir encountered many challenges.

2011. Akshardham Mahamandir Shilanyas Mahotsav

On 31 August, the *shilanyas* rituals for the Akshardham Mahamandir were performed by



Swamishri, senior sadhus and leading devotees of North America at the Swaminarayan Mandir in Mumbai. Thereafter on 6 October, the ceremony was performed on site in Robbinsville by Pujya Mahant Swami, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami and thousands of devotees. The entire ceremony was held in the divine presence of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj (Thakorji) and Swamishri who simultaneously performed the rituals at the Swaminarayan Mandir in Mumbai. The ceremony was beamed live via video-conference between Robbinsville and Mumbai. In conclusion, Swamishri blessed the event, saying, "Jai Swaminarayan to all. With such enthusiasm evident among the devotees, the project will be completed swiftly without any obstacles. We are pleased to see everyone's faith and conviction, and despite the hectic pace of life in America everyone has sacrificed their time and effort for this noble work. Because of your unity, the project work is progressing and others are inspired to join in with you. We pray that you all become happy, attain strength of spirit and experience peace. May everyone involved in the project as well as all future visitors to Akshardham attain peace and liberation."

The Akshardham Mahamandir *shilanyas* ceremony was held in six sessions over a period of three days (morning and evening) from 6 to 9 October. The volunteers put in great efforts in making the arrangements and preparing food packets for all the participating devotees. Once each session was over the volunteers cleaned up and arranged a new set of puja articles for the next session of devotees. At the conclusion of each session, the devotees filed past the foundation pit to place their bricks. 2012. Murti-pratishtha of Robbinsville Murtis in Ahmedabad

On 22 July 2012 (V.S. 2068, Shravan sud 3), at the Swaminarayan Mandir in Ahmedabad, Swamishri performed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals of the *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj, Guru Parampara and other deities for the Robbinsville *shikharbaddh* mandir.

The pre-pratishtha rituals were performed on the assembly hall stage by Pujya Mahant Swami, Pujya Tyagyallabh Swami, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami and leading devotees of North America. Thereafter, Swamishri performed the pratishtha, pujan and arti of all the murtis and in conclusion blessed the assembly, "By the wish of Shriji Maharaj, Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj, and your sacrifices, such a big mandir is being built. And the mandir is the best. For many millennia people will have darshan of the mandir and benefit in accordance with our traditions. I congratulate you all, because to accomplish this project in America is not at all easy. The devotees of America have consented and are prepared to build the mandir. They have donated money, and the sadhus and devotees have dedicated themselves regardless of day or night. This is why the mandir is nearing completion. My blessings to all to sustain this spirit and zeal for service. The mandir will be completed soon and will be celebrated."

2012. Inauguration of Satsang Activity Centre

From 19 to 21 October the Satsang Activity Centre in Robbinsville was inaugurated by Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami and Jnaneshwar Swami as part of the first phase of the Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex. The large assembly hall was declared open after the *murti-pratishtha* rituals were performed on behalf of Swamishri by Kothari Bhaktipriya Swami. Swamishri had consecrated all the *murtis* on 22 July 2012 in Ahmedabad. The *pratishtha* rituals and the inauguration of the Satsang Activity Centre occurred over five sessions to accommodate all the devotees who had registered. A grand *annakut*, prepared by women devotees, was offered to the *murtis*.

On this occasion, Sheree McGowan, President of Robbinsville Township Council, praised, "I've known about the project since it first came to planning, and to watch it grow has been amazing. And the workmanship is incredible. I am also impressed with your sense of volunteerism and community service, and wish you could give lessons to the rest of the world."

With the opening of the Satsang Activity Centre, various events that benefited the devotees and community at large were organized: 1. Health Fair 2. Blood Donation Drive 3. Annual Walkathons for national and local charities 4. Children's Health and Safety Day 5. Food Can Drives 6. Toys for Tots 7. Women's Conference and 8. Career and Education Seminars.

2013. Akshardham Mahamandir Jagatipith Shila Pujan

The foundation for the Akshardham Mahamandir was laid on 26 October. The event marked the largest continuous, single day concrete pour in the history of New Jersey.

The proposed Akshardham Mahamandir in Robbinsville will comprise of nine *shikhars* and 21 *upa-shikhars*. The entire mandir will be built on the *jagatipith*. The ritual placing of the first stone of the Akshardham Mahamandir *jagatipith* was held in five sessions over three days on 22, 23 and 24 November 2013. Swamishri had sent a sanctified *yantra* on which the first stone was placed. Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami performed the ritual placing of the first stone in the presence of 50 BAPS sadhus and thousands of devotees from all over North America.

The Mayor of Robbinsville, David Fried, was present during the ritual. He said, "I feel very happy and honoured to be a part of this ceremony here today. I've seen here your volunteers help out in this project. Our country needs such spirits. Such selfless service is most admirable and inspiring. I feel proud and thankful that such a project is being done in our township. I thank all of you."

During the event a three-day *yagna* was held on the spot where the *garbhagruha* would be.

After this event, the planning and preparations for the *murti-pratishtha* celebration of the *shikharbaddh* Swaminarayan Mandir, scheduled for August 2014, began in earnest.

MANDIR CONSTRUCTION

Robbinsville, New Jersey

INTRODUCTION

Building a mandir is a very complex and arduous exercise. Firstly, it is not like any contemporary construction work. The mandir has to conform to the ancient science of Indian architecture in the *shilpa* shastras. Secondly, other than requiring sufficient funds, the process of building a *shikharbaddh* mandir involves site selection, drawing and sanctioning plans, choosing the appropriate stone, commissioning seasoned sculptors, transporting and finally piecing the stones together. Underlying the whole process of building a mandir is the colossal dedication and effort of artisans and BAPS volunteers.

Some salient aspects of how the Swaminarayan Mandir in Robbinsville was built are as follows.

PLANNING AND STONE SELECTION

In the initial stages, plans for the Robbinsville mandir were drawn and submitted to the town council for approval. Once they were sanctioned, the selection of stone was made taking into consideration the environment and weather of the region. Weak, fragile, or fragmented stone erodes over time.

For the Akshardham site in Robbinsville certain types of stone were not fit for the extreme local climate. In order to ensure that the mandir lasts for over a thousand years, rigorous testing was performed on many stone samples from around the world.

The developers and engineers selected Italian Carrara marble for the Robbinsville *shikharbaddh* Swaminarayan Mandir. It's exquisite splendour



and quality to be intricately carved has been appreciated for centuries. In particular, Italian marble stands out for the right balance of beauty and durability. Blocks of marble were mined from the quarries in Italy. In all, a total of 68,000 cubic feet was extracted.

TRANSPORTATION

After being selected and resized for transport, the stone was shipped nearly 4,500 miles by sea to Gujarat and then to the stone workshops in Rajasthan. More than 2,000 sculptors sculpted the stones at different workshops. Artisans who have inherited this trade for generations, transformed the slabs of stone into ornate components of the mandir.

DESIGNING AND CARVING

The design and construction process is mandated by the ancient *shilpa* shastras or treatises on architecture and construction, which dictate the size of the components and some of the



structural engineering. The series of traditional stone-mandir constructions over the past three decades by Pramukh Swami Maharaj has brought a resurgence of this ancient style of mandir construction and provided a means of livelihood for many traditional artisans and their families. Many artisans were also able to give up their addictions and bad habits due to their association with the volunteer-devotees and sadhus who guided or managed their work at the stone workshops and mandir site.

Narottamsinh Rana is an artisan who has been involved in building 22 BAPS *shikharbaddh* mandirs around the world since 1992. He also worked on the BAPS Swaminarayan Mandir in Robbinsville. Prior to 1992, he was working in his local family business, finding it difficult to find his way spiritually, morally and financially. He opined, "The benefit I got, besides my employment with the Sanstha, is satsang and the values found within. Due to contact of sadhus and devotees, my family and I began attending the mandir and even held *ghar sabha* to stay connected."



SHIPPING AND ASSEMBLY

Once the stones were carved and properly numbered at the workshops in Rajasthan, they were carefully packed to prevent damage and shipped to Robbinsville, 8,000 miles (12,875 km.) away. The average shipping time was approximately 24 days.

Once they arrived on site, the stones were laid out on pallets and put in order based on a unique coding system. Different alphanumerical codes identified each stone: which component it is a part of and the layer of its placement. Much like a 3D puzzle, the mandir was then put together stone by stone by artisans. Each stone had a specific role in the construction process. If one piece was misplaced, damaged or forgotten, the construction process would be disrupted.

Each milestone in the mandir construction was marked by a Vedic ritual; especially the groundbreaking ritual of the site, the *shilanyas* or foundation-stone-laying ceremony, the first stone-laying ritual on the *jagatipith*, the first pillar-laying ritual in the mandir and others.

CONCLUSION

During the 3 year construction process that began in 2011, countless volunteers and artisans contributed their services to this architectural and spiritual wonder. Pramukh Swami Maharaj's inspiration was the driving force for their selfless service.

The exterior enclosure over the Robbinsville mandir will help to protect the marble from the harsh climate and allow visitors to comfortably engage in darshan and prayers. However, its true significance lies in its symbolic message: the need to build a mandir within. By developing qualities that allow God and his Sadhu to reside within, we attain true spiritual enlightenment and peace. Those who were involved and performed *seva* in building the Robbinsville *shikharbaddh* mandir can attest to this life transformative process.











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YAGNAS FOR WORLD PEACE 1 to 3 and 8 August 2014

The Mandir Mahotsav festivities began with a series of Yagnas for World Peace and Family Harmony.

2014 MA

Due to the large number of devotees eager to partake in this historic *yagna*, with many coming from countries outside of USA and Canada as well, six identical sessions were held to accommodate them all. At registration they were assigned the session in which they were to attend.

A special 486 x 164 x 40 feet marquee was erected to serve as the *yagna mandap*, in which 231 *yagna kunds* were built. A breakup of the 17,566 devotees who participated in the six *yagnas* is as follows:

At the beginning of each session, Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami and other sadhus performed the initial rituals on the main stage, guided by *purohits* Shri Mukeshbhai and Shri Vasudevbhai, who chanted the Vedic *yagna* mantras.

The *murtis* to be consecrated in the new *shi-kharbhaddh* mandir were placed on the main stage: Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj, Shri Ghanshyam Maharaj, Shri Harikrishna Maharaj, Shri Radha-Krishna Dev, Shri Sita-Ram Dev, Shri Hanumanji, Shri Lakshmanji, Shri Shiv-Parvati Dev, Shri Ganapatiji, Shri Kartikeyaji and the Gunatit Guru Parampara.

After performing the *arti*, Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami addressed the devotees, "For Hindus who believe in scripturally sanctioned rituals and *murti pujan*, mandirs are a lifeline. When the *murtis* are ritually consecrated, they became a living form of God. And only one who fully beholds God can invoke the presence of God in the *murtis*. Swamishri had performed *pujan* of these *murtis*

After the sadhus departed from the *yagna* arena, the devotees, sitting with family members and friends, sat in groups of 20 around a *yagna kund*. Experienced Brahmins stationed at each

spectacular, colourful *nagaryatra* of the *murtis* to be consecrated in the *shikharbaddh* mandir took place on the grounds of the vast Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex. Devotees from the USA, Canada, UK, Europe, Africa, Middle East, Australia, New Zealand and other countries participated.

The *nagaryatra* took place on the circular road inside the complex, with approximately 20,000 devotees observing and cheering along the roadside. The entire atmosphere was charged with divine spirituality.

At the front of the *nagaryatra* was a banner with the words, 'Mandir – A Place of Paramount Peace.'

Behind were the following items:

- Murti of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj in a decorated Lamborghini car.
- Eight motorcyclists waving BAPS flags.
- Balaks on bicycles.
- Akshar Dhwani Band from Dallas, Texas, playing a variety of bhajan tunes.
- Youths carrying large flags of India and America.
- Devotees of BAPS Africa with a decorated banner featuring the *murtis* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Pramukh Swami Maharaj and the names of all BAPS mandirs in Africa. Also, 100 devotees in traditional African dress (called 'banango') dancing joyously.
- Devotees carrying the national flags of over

15 countries.

 25-ft. high Mayur Rath (Peacock Chariot) carrying the *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj: Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Aksharbrahman Gunatitanand Swami.

Around the *rath* devotional songs were sung to the accompaniment of instruments.

The *rath* was pulled by *balaks* and *kishores* dressed in *lengho-jhabho* and a yellow Mandir Mahotsav sash.

- Youths carrying banners with messages such as 'Mandir Instils Values', 'To Study is Devotion', etc.
- Youths dressed as various professionals, e.g. doctors, lawyers, scientists, soldiers, nurses, etc. to highlight their contributions to American society.
- Balaks dressed in upvastra and lengho engaged in daily devotional activities, such as, mala, arti, etc. With them were young

balaks dressed as paramhansas.

- Shri Radha-Krishna Dev on a decorated *rath*, surrounded by youths waving BAPS flags.
- Youths in traditional dress singing bhajans.
- BAPS trustees and Mandir Coordinators.
- *Balaks* dressed as clowns and walking on tall stilts.
- On both outer sides of the *nagaryatra* were *kishores* walking while waving BAPS flags.
- Shri Sita-Ram Dev on a *rath* with a replica of a decorated hut (similar to the type at Panchvati, where they stayed during their forest exile) and tall trees. *Murtis* of Shri Hanumanji and Shri Lakshmanji were at the front of the *rath*.
- Balaks carrying a banner with the message: 'Mandirs Preserve Culture.'
- *Kishores* in peacock costumes dancing around the decorated *rath* carrying the

murtis of Brahmaswarup Bhagatji Maharaj and Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj.

- Group of male devotees walking.
- Women devotees in traditional dress walking while carrying *kalash-shrifal* and clothwrapped shastras on their heads in traditional style of honour and respect.
- Yuvatis waving flags.
- *Yuvatis* carrying 'Mandir Mahotsav' and 'Mandir Fosters Devotion' banners.
- Women devotees pulling a decorated *rath* carrying the *murti* of Shri Ghanshyam Maharaj.
- *Yuvatis* dressed as famous women devotees of the past, e.g. Mirabai, Shabri, Ladhibai, etc.
- *Kishoris* artistically waving red and blue ribbons.
- Balikas and kishoris performing ras dance.
- Murtis of Brahmaswarup Yogiji Maharaj and Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj on

the Gaj Rath (Elephant Chariot).

- Balikas and kishoris dancing.
- Mothers of youths from USA who have become sadhus singing *dhun*.
- Murti of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj (panchdhatu) on a decorated rath.
- Banner: 'Mandir Strengthens Morality.'
- Women devotees singing the prayer 'Mahābalavant Māyā tamāri...'.
- *Yuvatis* and women devotees performing traditional festival dances.
- Shri Shiv-Parvati Dev, Ganapatiji and Kartikeyaji on a decorated *rath*.

Over 400 *balaks*, *kishores* and *yuvaks*, and 700 *balikas*, *kishoris*, *yuvatis* and hundreds of elder men and women devotees participated in the *nagaryatra*, which stretched over 1.5 kilometres from beginning to end.

MURTI-PRATISHTHA CELEBRATIONS

9-10 August 2014

9 August 2014 (Shravan sud 14, V.S. 2070): Pre-Pratishtha Rituals

At 7.00 a.m., during the auspicious morning *muhurt*, Pujya Mahant Swami, Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami, Pujya Yagnavallabh Swami and other sadhus began the pre*pratishtha mahapuja* rituals. Also participating were the devotees who had made significant sacrifices to build this mandir.

At 9.00 a.m., Swamishri arrived for the *murti sthapan* rituals. All the *murtis* to be consecrated were first offered *abhishek* with *panchamrut* (yogurt, milk, ghee, sugar, honey mixture). Swamishri then performed the *arti* and blessed the participating devotees. Thereafter, a special assembly was held in Akshar Vatika, where thousands of devotees had gathered.

Among the guests were senior sannyasis of the Himalayan Academy in Hawaii: Shri Paramacharya Sadashivnath Swami and Shri Senthilnath Swami. They presented a *mala* of *rudraksh* beads to Mahant Swami for Pramukh Swami Maharaj. *Balaks* from BAPS centres in the northeast region performed a traditional dance to the tune of 'Mandiram, mandiram, mandiram, Swaminarayan Mandiram...'.

Shishu balaks of the northeast region melodiously sang Vedic mantras hailing the glory of Shri Purushottam Narayan, Shri Akshar-Purushottam and the guru.


Following this, Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami, principal coordinator of the entire North America Akshardham project, addressed the assembly. He narrated the special design and construction features of the mandir. Then he described the plans for the beautiful Akshardham Mahamandir and requested all to contribute in every way possible.

Congressman Frank Pallone addressed the assembly, "I don't think I've ever seen such carvings and such magnificence in any religious facility, any where. And I think it's a testimony to all of you and to the Indian community and to the Hindu community that you built this facility.

"It preaches tolerance for other religions, it preaches peace and it basically preaches non-violence and I think it's so important that Americans who are not of Indian descent learn more about Hinduism and what it means.

"It will not only be a place where all of you can come and meditate and contemplate and think about God and what you can do for your community, spiritually, but I think it also will provide an opportunity for those that are not Indian or not Hindu to see what Hinduism is all about and appreciate the beauty and spirituality of it."

At the end, Mahant Swami addressed the assembly, "Param Pujya Swamishri has undertaken

this mammoth project to build Akshardham, in which we all have to give our support. God's work will be done, but we have to join in it."

Then, at 11.20 a.m., Swamishri arrived on the Akshar Vatika stage, welcomed by the Akshar Dhwani Band of Dallas. The entire campus echoed with *jai naads* as the *sadguru* sadhus honoured Swamishri with garlands.

Also on this occasion, the doctors who have taken great care of Swamishri's health were honoured with garlands by the senior sadhus.

On this momentous day, Swamishri wrote a message, "Whoever comes here will attain liberation. This Akshardham is a place that will mould everyone's lives."

10 August 2014 (Shravan *sud* Punam, V.S. 2070; Raksha Bandhan): Murti-Pratishtha Rituals

Today marked the auspicious day of Raksha Bandhan and the second stage of the mandir consecration rituals. At 8.00 a.m., Pujya Mahant Swami, Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami and Pujya Ishwarcharan Swami had commenced the *murti-pratishtha mahapuja* rituals.

At 9.20 a.m., Swamishri first arrived on the Akshar Vatika stage to give darshan to the thousands of devotees who had gathered for this historic occasion.

Then at 9.45 a.m., Swamishri entered the garbhagruha to perform the murti-pratishtha rituals. While Swamishri performed the rituals in the central shrine before the murtis of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Aksharbrahman Gunatitanand Swami, simultaneously, Mahant Swami performed the rituals before Shri Ghanshyam Maharaj, Ishwarcharan Swami before Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and Tyagvallabh Swami before Shri Radha-Krishna Dev.

As the Vedic mantras were recited, Swamishri and the senior sadhus performed the *nyasvidhi*, *netra-anavaran* and other rituals.

At 10.15 a.m., after the traditional *annakut* had been arranged before the *murtis*, Swamishri performed the *murti-pratishtha arti*. Thereafter,

Swamishri offered *mantra-pushpanjali* and applied a *chandlo* to all the *murtis*.

After the *pratishtha* rituals were complete, Mahant Swami garlanded Swamishri, and Tyagvallabh Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami offered a decorated *chadar*.

To commemorate Raksha Bandhan, Mahant Swami tied a *rakhi* on Swamishri's wrist. Swamishri blessed everyone, "I pray to Maharaj that you all become happy and prosperous."

At 11.00 a.m., the *murti-pratishtha* assembly began in the presence of over 15,000 devotees. The stage was beautifully decorated with *shikhar* and arch designs.

Shishu balaks sang Vedic mantras at the start of the assembly.

Some of the invited guests then addressed the assembly. On behalf of Robbinsville Township Mayor Dave Fried and Timothy McGough, Director of Community & Economic Development, welcomed BAPS to Robbinsville, "The Township of Robbinsville is extremely happy that BAPS chose Robbinsville to build this magnificent mandir. It will be a source of inspiration to all those who visit for generations. Already the Township has received the generosity and friendship of your congregants who have participated in so many community events. Truly, Robbinsville has benefited by having this mandir here."

Maryland Congressman, Steny Hoyer, said, "This mandir will surely not only be a place of worship, but also of service; it will be a place where the saying 'In the joy of others lies our own' is translated from words into actions, as followers of this movement have done throughout the world for the benefit of millions and millions of people.... It will bring some of the vibrancy, diversity, and spiritual richness of India to the northeastern United States to the benefit of all of us."

New Jersey Senator, Cory Booker, said, "I am so impressed, I am so impressed, indeed. I give reverence to an extraordinary structure that will stand in *(Contd. on pg. 53)*

he inauguration of the new *shikarbaddh* mandir in Robbinsville, New Jersey, marked the completion of the second phase of the Swaminarayan Akshardham Complex.

The new mandir is built using 68,000 cu.ft. of Italian Carrara marble. From quarries in Italy, the stone was sent to ten workshops in and around Pindvada in Rajasthan, India, where over 2,000 craftsmen sculpted the stones. Once carved according to the specified designs, the individual pieces of varying sizes were numbered and shipped to Robbinsville in New Jersey for assembly on site – a total journey of about 21,500 km.

Visitors to the new mandir are greeted by 236 sculpted peacocks in the Mayur Dwar (Peacock Gate), built of Bulgarian limestone.

The two-storey mandir is built in the *nagara* style of Indian mandir architecture and features *phamsana* type *shikhars*. Eye-catching pillars, decorative *jharukhas* (windows), embellished *mandovars* (inner and outer rear walls of *garbhagruha*), two large *ghummats* (domes) and 58 delightfully sculpted ceilings are the other main elements of the mandir. The rich and detailed carvings depict many of the important themes and messages of Hinduism.

On climbing the front steps of the mandir, visitors see the *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, sculpted from one large stone, in the ceiling above.

On the outer *mandovar* are various carved poses of Ganapatiji, the 24 *chaturbhuj* forms of Vishnu, and beautifully designed stone windows.

The inner *mandovar* features sculptures of 91 decorated elephants in a variety of devotional postures, as well as statuettes of the presiding deities of the eight cardinal directions and the *murtis* of Shri Nar-Narayan, Shri Rukmani-Vithoba, Shri Lakshmi-Narayan and Shri Padmavati-Tirupati Balaji. At the centre is a sculpted scene of Pramukh Swami Maharaj performing the *murti-pratishtha* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj for the Robbinsville mandir in Ahmedabad.

The mandir has 94 pillars, which are adorned with statuettes of devas, avatars, rishis, *acharyas*, river goddesses and famous saints and devotees of the past. *Akshar muktas* in welcoming poses add to the beauty of the pillars. Linking the pillars at the top are *torans* (arches) with splendid intricate designs.

The inner walls of the mandir are decorated with ten scenes, made of multicoloured stones, depicting incidents from the life of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Aksharbrahman Gunatitanand Swami which highlight the Akshar-Purushottam philosophy.

The main dome is adorned with statuettes of 16 *gandharvas* with garlands and 16 devas greeting all in various traditional ways.

On entering the main hall of the mandir, to the left are the shrines of

Shri Ram-Sita-Lakshman-Hanumanji and, further along, of Brahmaswarup Bhagatji Maharaj and Brahmaswarup Yogiji Maharaj. To the right, the first shrine is of Shri Shiv-Parvati-Ganapati-Kartikeyaji and the second shrine is of Brahmaswarup Shastriji Maharaj and Pragat Brahmaswarup Pramukh Swami Maharaj. At the front of the mandir, in the central shrine are the *murtis* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and Aksharbrahman Gunatitanand Swami. The right hand shrine houses the *murti* of Shri Ghanshyam Maharaj and the left hand shrine has the *murtis* of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and Shri Radha-Krishna Dev.

The entire mandir is enclosed in a permanent structure to facilitate darshan and worship, and protect the stone from the region's harsh climate.

n addition to the main celebrations described in the preceding pages, other notable events also took place during the Mandir Mahotsav. They are described below.

VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION ASSEMBLY 7 August 2014

Over 4,000 volunteers, young and old, men and women, contributed to the great success of the Mandir Mahotsav. To acknowledge their selfless contributions, a special assembly was held on the morning of 7 August in Akshar Vatika.

Pujya Tyagvallabh Swami addressed the volunteers, describing the importance and benefits of such service, "By serving, one is able to overcome one's inner malicious instincts and become pure. By such service one earns the blessings of God and his holy Sadhu and develops noble virtues."

An inspiring cultural programme was presented by the *balaks, kishores* and *yuvaks* of the northeast region.



Since 1965, BAPS has operated student hostels (*chhatralayas*) in various towns and cities throughout Gujarat. Thousands of youths have benefited from their stay in these hostels and have migrated to countries worldwide, including the USA and Canada. During the Mandir Mahotsav, a special convention was held for former APC students. The convention began at 4.00 p.m. and over 540 alumni of the BAPS hostels in Vallabh Vidyanagar, Nadiad, Atladra (Vadodara), Surat, Bhavnagar, Mehsana, Dhule, Ukai, Bardoli and Adipur attended this grand reunion in the presence of Pujya Mahant Swami.

Viveknidhi Swami (formerly one of the resident sadhus at APC, Vidyanagar) and other alumni recollected some of their experiences from their time in the hostel. Pre-recorded video messages from Yagnapriya Swami and Sadhujivan Swami were shown in the assembly. Based on Swamishri's wish, Shri Harikrishna Maharaj was welcomed and honoured in the assembly.

Finally, Mahant Swami addressed everyone

Engagement Ceremony: 9 August

10-12 August 2014


Over 1,500 BAPS volunteers attended the BAPS North America Leadership Seminar held in the presence of Pramukh Swami Maharaj, as well as Mahant Swami, Tyagvallabh Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami.

The seminar was based on the theme 'Yagnapurush Chhe Sathe'. It commemorated Shastriji Maharaj's 150th birth celebration by elaborating on the four guiding principles on which he established the BAPS: *agna, upasana, sadbhav* and *paksh*. Over the course of the seminar, speeches by the *sadguru* sadhus explored how these four aspects are integral for leaders to understand and imbibe to enhance their spiritual lives.

AKSHARDHAM MAHAMANDIR BHUMITAL PUJAN

15 August 2014

Swamishri proceeded from the *shikharbaddh* mandir to the Akshardham Mahamandir site seated in a Mayur Rath. He was preceded by a procession of *balaks* and *kishores* waving Indian and BAPS flags, devotees dancing joyously to the rhythm of drums and sadhus. On both sides of the path, thousands of devotees were seated for darshan.

At the stone pillars of the Akshardham entrance gate, which were draped with colourful flowers, Mahant Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami honoured Swamishri with garlands.

At 11.10 a.m. Swamishri began the bhumital

pujan rituals. He performed *pujan* of the main *nidhikumbh* by filling it with *panchratna*, *panchdhatu*, the waters of 108 holy rivers and flowers. After covering its mouth with a small red cloth and tying it with a *nadachhadi*, Swamishri placed the *nidhikumbh* in a small pit above which the *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan will be consecrated in future. Swamishri then performed *pujan* of the instruments for construction and filled the main pit with cement using a trowel. Swamishri then placed his feet on the ground to sanctify the area.

He also performed *pujan* of the other *nidhi-kumbhs* and in his presence Mahant Swami and Ishwarcharan Swami placed them in the pits marking the sites of the other *khands* where *murtis* will be placed.

Swamishri then instructed the sadhus to offer *sashtang dandvat pranams* to the Akshardham site.

MANDIR DEDICATION CEREMONY 16-17 August 2014

Following the Vedic *murti-pratishtha* ceremony of the new *shikharbaddh* mandir, two separate Mandir Dedication Ceremonies were held.

On 16 August, local civic dignitaries and other non-Indian residents were invited. Following a brief introductory speech by Kanubhai Patel (CEO, BAPS Inc.) and a short video about the mandir, everyone gathered at the front steps of the mandir. Here, leading dignitaries untied a ceremonial ribbon and declared the mandir open to

On 17 August, leaders and representatives of Hindu mandirs and organizations from various regions were invited. Swamishri celebrates the festival of Rath Yatra

Swamishri blesses devotees on Guru Purnima

JUNE 1, Sunday

The 2014 annual youth training batch was inaugurated in Swamishri's presence in Sarangpur. On behalf of the youths, Viveksagar Swami offered garlands of *mogra* flowers and *nadachhadi* to Swamishri. Then Swamishri blessed 122 youths from far while the bhajan "*Ame au Swāminā bālak*..." was being played.

2, Monday; 64th Pramukh Varni Din

Devotees from far and wide had come for Swamishri's darshan because the day commemorated 64 years of his appointment as President of BAPS. When Swamishri came out of his quarters to give darshan he had put on a *pagh* similar to Shastriji Maharaj's, had smearings of *chandan* on his forehead and a large conch shell in his hands. A giant backdrop of the room in Ambli Vali Pol, where Swamishri was appointed as president, added to the ambience of the event. The *murtis* of Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj were arranged in front of the backdrop. Swamishri was honoured with a *kumkum chandlo* and garlands by senior sadhus.

To celebrate the occasion, youths danced in

colourful costumes. Thereafter, Swamishri was given a written version of Shastriji Maharaj's blessings to read. Then Swamishri's pledge to Shastriji Maharaj was relayed in Swamishri's own voice through the audio system.

Swamishri also rang a bell while the bhajan "Gunatit kā dankā ālam me..." was being played. Then some youths performed a skit showing the joy in Sarangpur after receiving the news of Swamishri's appointment as president. Finally, Swamishri sanctified 20 vessels of shiro to be distributed as prasad to all.

Swamishri also ate a little shiro to the joy of all.

3, Tuesday

Swamishri performed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals of *arti* and *pujan* of the *murtis* for a BAPS *hari* mandir in Utvala in the Mahuva region. Thereafter he blessed the devotees of Utvala from far.

17, Tuesday

In the Pramukh Darshan Vatika Swamishri performed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals of *arti* and *mantra pushpanjali* of the *murtis* for the BAPS *hari* mandir in Malad (East), a suburb of Mumbai. Thereafter, Swamishri blessed 400 devotees of Malad from far.

29, Sunday; Rath Yatra Celebration

In the morning, Swamishri came out on to the stage of Pramukh Darshan Vatika to celebrate the Rath Yatra festival. Swamishri operated a remotecontrolled chariot of Shri Harikrishna Maharaj.

In the evening, from 7.50 to 9.00 p.m., an assembly to celebrate the Rath Yatra festival was held on the mandir grounds. At 9.00 p.m. Swamishri came out of his quarters to celebrate the Rath Yatra festival. Swamishri was seated in an illuminated peacock-shaped chariot. A festive procession preceded him: sadhus playing kartals up front, followed by youths waving the BAPS flags, youths carrying electrically lit torches, a chariot similar to the one pulled in Jagannathpuri with the festive murti of Bhagwan Swaminarayan, a small remote-controlled chariot with Shri Harikrishna Maharaj and finally Swamishri's chariot. The procession advanced towards the Yagnapurush Smruti Mandir with sadhus, parshads and devotees engaged in darshan from the large open ground. After darshan at the Smruti Mandir Swamishri performed arti of Thakorji and Shastriji Maharaj. About 4,500 devotees participated in the Rath Yatra celebration.

30, Monday

Swamishri performed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals of *arti* and *mantra pushpanjali* of the new *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj and Guru Parampara to be installed at the existing BAPS *hari* mandir in Nakura, Kenya. Thereafter, Swamishri blessed the devotees of Nakura from far.

JULY

6, Sunday

Swamishri performed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals of the metallic (*panchdhatu*) *abhishek murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan to be installed in the *rang mandap* of Gadhada mandir and the marble *murtis* of Guru Parampara to be installed in the newly built guru-*shikhars* in the mandir *pradakshina*. Swamishri ritually touched the *murtis* with a special rod (*suvarnashalaka*) to invoke the Divine. Swamishri performed the *abhishek* of the *murti* of Bhagwan Swaminarayan and prayed that the wishes of all devotees are fulfilled. Swamishri also performed the *pratishtha arti* and *mantra pushpanjali* of the *murtis* for the BAPS *hari* mandir in Luvara, Gadhada region. Thereafter, Swamishri blessed the devotees of Luvara from far.

Swamishri inaugurated a Gujarati book, 'Varta re Varta', for children and a DVD on the youth *adhiveshan* held in 2012, Sarangpur, published by Swaminarayan Aksharpith.

7, Monday

Swamishri performed the *pratishtha* rituals of the *abhishek murti* of Nilkanth Varni to be installed in the BAPS mandir in Houston, the *murtis* of Shri Guru Parampara to be installed in the guru-*shikhars* at Atladra mandir, *murtis* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj, Shri Ghanshyam Maharaj and Shri Guru Parampara for the BAPS *hari* mandir in Bhaili and the canvas *murtis* of Shri Guru Parampara for the BAPS *hari* mandir in Karakhdi. Amidst Vedic chantings, Swamishri invoked the Divine by ritually touching the *murtis* with a *suvarnashalaka*. Thereafter, Swamishri performed the *pratishtha arti* and *mantra pushpanjali*. Finally, Swamishri performed the *abhishek* of Shri Nilkanth Varni to be installed in Houston.

12, Saturday; Guru Purnima Celebration

From early morning, thousands of devotees had assembled in the mandir precincts of Sarangpur to celebrate Guru Purnima. As Swamishri's wheelchair advanced from his quarters towards the mandir, innumerable devotees, seated at the Pramukh Darshan Vatika, Narayan Mandapam and the large open ground, rejoiced at his darshan. After Thakorji's darshan in the mandir Swamishri performed *arti*. On arriving back to the Narayan Mandapam stage Swamishri inaugurated an audio CD on the theme song commemorating Shastriji Maharaj's 150th Birth Anniversary. Swamishri blessed the devotees from far.

Swamishri also inaugurated a textbook on "Swaminarayan Vedant" by Shrutiprakash Swami for the first year B.A. Sanskrit curriculum taught at the Swaminarayan Sanskrit Vidyalaya, Sarangpur.

At 7.25 p.m., the Guru Purnima celebration assembly commenced outside the Yagnapurush Mandapam. The assembly celebration was themed 'The Ideal of Guru Bhakti - Shastriji Maharaj'. The celebration programme included dramas performed by youths, and speeches on the virtues of Shastriji Maharaj delivered by sadhus. At 9.30 p.m. Swamishri arrived for the Guru Purnima celebration seated in a decorated chariot pulled by sadhus. The murtis of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj and gurus Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj were also installed in the chariot. While the chariot was heading towards the 'Yagnapurush Smruti Mandir' Swamishri looked on both sides of the pathway, blessing the devotees. At the Smruti Mandir Swamishri did darshan and performed arti of the murtis of Thakorji and Shastriji Maharaj. Then Swamishri's chariot was pulled towards the middle of the Yagnapurush Mandapam stage. With the murtis of Thakorji installed on a high pedestal and gurus Shastriji Maharaj and Yogiji Maharaj on either side, the rituals of guru pujan commenced. The entire assembly offered flower petals and performed arti as guru pujan. Thereafter, Swamishri inaugurated a Gujarati publication by Swaminarayan Aksharpith, 'Satsang Vihar, Part 3' and 'Brahmasannidhi, 2012'. Senior sadhus honoured Swamishri with flower garlands and a shawl. Swamishri also blessed the stage guests from far. At 10.27 p.m. Swamishri departed towards the Narayan Mandapam and his living quarters. More than 14,000 devotees were present in the evening for the Guru Purnima celebration.

13, Sunday

A five-day *shibir*, themed 'Shanti', for 55 and 35 *kishores-kishoris* of USA and UK, respectively, was inaugurated in Swamishri's presence in the morning.

15, Tuesday

Swamishri preformed the *murti-pratishtha* rituals of *arti* and *pujan* of the *murtis* for the BAPS *hari* mandir in Vaghai (Dang district) and a *murti* of Shri Akshar-Purushottam Maharaj for the BAPS tribal hostel in Rambhas (Dang). Thereafter, Swamishri blessed the devotees of Dang district from far.

16, Wednesday

Swamishri performed the Vedic rituals for the foundation-stone-laying ceremony of the *shilas* for the newly proposed Smruti Mandir at the site of the present one in Gondal. Swamishri ritually sanctified the *nidhikumbh* to be placed in the foundation pit and also placed sanctified roses on the newly proposed plans for the Smruti Mandir. Prior to Swamishri's arrival the pre-rituals for the *shila pujan* were perfomed by Ishwarcharan Swami and Viveksagar Swami.

IMPORTANCE OF SPIRITUAL UNDERSTANDING 1 June

Swamishri's words and life reflect his spirit of servitude and humility.

INTRODUCTION OF SWAMISHRI, 1 July

An attendant asked Swamishri, "If someone were to ask us about your introduction, how should we reply?"

Swamishri revealed, "One who does bhajan." The attendant added, "What if we were to say that you are the President of BAPS?"

Swamishri replied emphatically, "No, no. Say he does bhajan of God."

GURU BHAKTI, 3 July

Swamishri was shown a video about how the BAPS Swaminarayan Mandir in Los Angless was accomplished. At the end there was a photo of the mandir.

Swamishri had envisioned building the mandir in 1996, and it was built and consecrated in 2012. Swamishri's attendant remarked, "Swami, you had taken great pains and put in colossal efforts in making this mandir, and yet at the end they've taken a photo of the mandir instead of yours!"

Swamishri remained silent. The attendant quizzed further, "But you have built it!"



BAPS CHARITIES FOOD DRIVES 1 August 2014, Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania



In July, volunteers of BAPS Charities in Tanzania conducted five food drives, donating nearly a metric ton of food and supplies to the following charitable organizations:

Children's Retention Home: It was started in 1962 in response to rising crime rates among the

youth, the home is run by the Tanzanian government and offers the inmates a chance for rehabilitation and re-entry into society as productive individuals.

Al Masi Orphanage: It is a certified home for orphan children founded in 1997. Some of the orphans are also disabled. The children attend the nearby government school, where they get free education.

Al Hidaya Orphanage: It is a certified home for parentless children founded in 2008. The children attend the nearby government school.

Al Furqan Islamic Centre: It was founded in 2011 by Mr. Hamisi Omari, who is the current caretaker of the orphanage. In addition to housing, the orphanage provides the children with free education in a nearby school.

Salvation Army Matumaini: It was founded in 1933 by British volunteers working in Tanzania. At present, the school is sustained by foreign aid and support from local citizens. The school provides free education to 200 physically disabled children, aged between 3 and 17.

Thereafter, children and youths performed an energetic, traditional dance depicting the glory of mandirs.




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
