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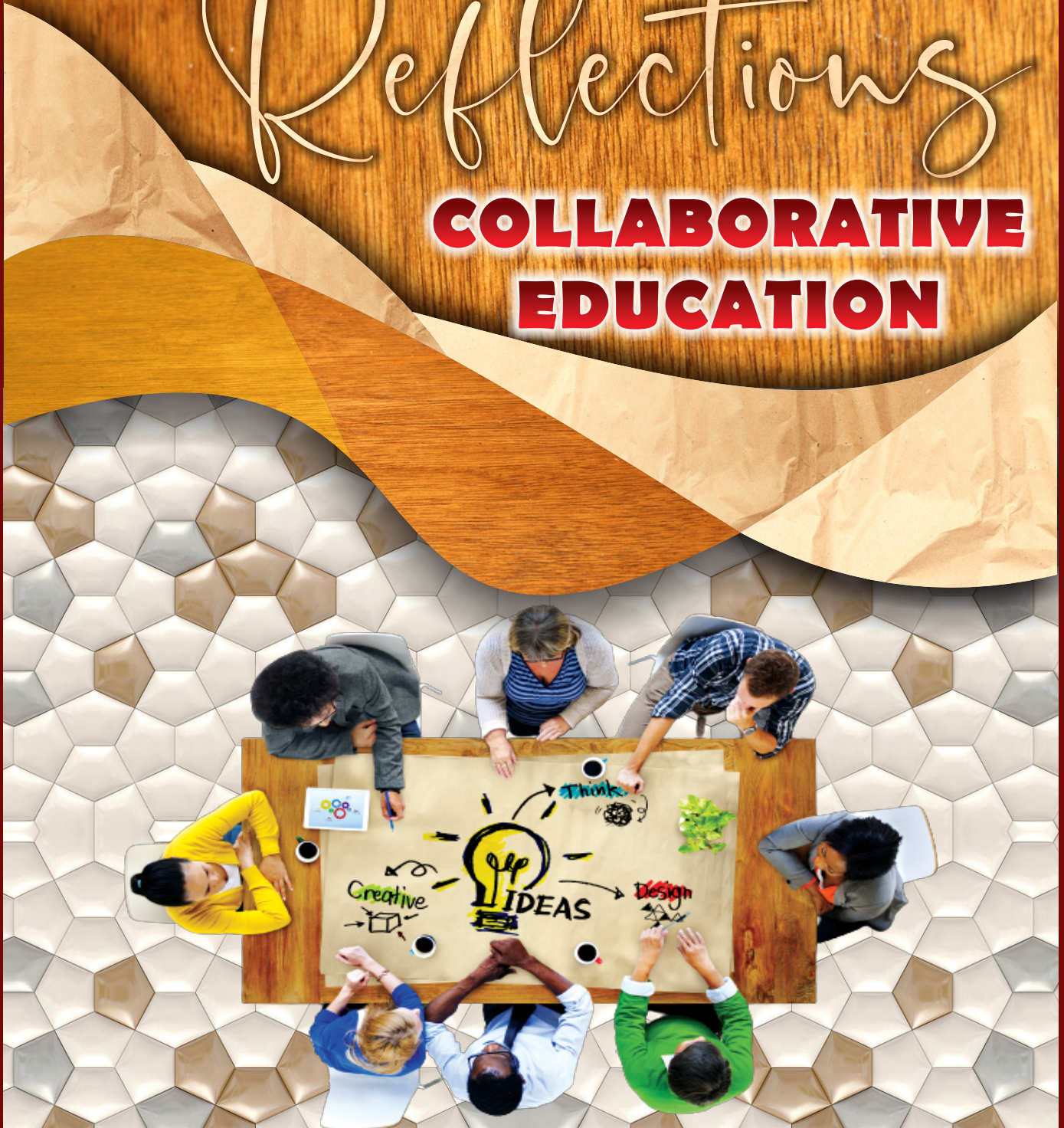

a) Kindergarten Motor skills

Young children's growth and development has a pattern, sequence and progress in several areas such as physical growth, capacity for language and comprehension. Children engage actively in the process to learn, practice and master skills at each level to develop self confidence, and motivation. Education at The Swaminarayan School is an integrated process with a flexible curriculum that takes into account the heterogeneity of the learner and learning styles. Emphasis is laid on acquiring linguistic & logical ability and nurturing multiple intelligence by adopting innovative methods to stimulate interest and attention among the students. This opens up pathways to holistic and harmonious development of the young learners. 'The innovative curriculum for the Pre Primary' is in use to reinforce values, concepts, ideas, skills, and activities.



The school follows the schedule and programme with a fair amount of flexibility. Changes are made from time to time as demanded by the environment and the emerging situations in the classroom. The students are graded regularly based on participation and performance in class activities. The areas of growth and development: Physical, Language, Personal, Emotional, Social, Intellectual/ Cognitive, Aesthetic Development, etc.

ACADEMIC SYLLABUS PATTERN



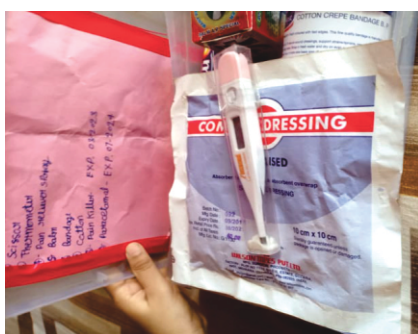
b) Art Integrated and Subject Enrichment Activities

In the month of September, Art Integrated and Subject Enrichment Activities were conducted to evaluate the first term learnings. The academic year 2021-22 is divided into two halves with approximately 50% syllabus in each term. The first term examination for the classes I to IX & XI commenced in the month of October. Likewise, the Preliminary Examination for the classes X & XII was simultaneously conducted. For a holistic development, Co-Scholastic Activities and Subject Enrichment Activities, Art Integrated and Practical Approach activities which aim at enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork is the generic criteria for grading of Internal assessment. The assessment structure for classes V to VIII comprises of two terms, each term having a 40 marks Periodic Assessment and 40 marks written examination. The question papers will be based on critical thinking and competency-based questions in MCQs format.



a) World First Aid Day

Every year on the second Saturday of September, World First Aid Day is observed to promote awareness about how first aid can save lives. It occurred on September 11 this year. The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) believes that first aid should be available to all. To spread awareness of first aid and its necessity, students were motivated to prepare first aid box and be ready to deal in any emergency. This activity helped the students identify various materials from the first aid kit.



b) Virtual Debate on Nutrition

National Nutrition Mission was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 8th March, 2018. The Programme strives to reduce the level of stunting, under – nutrition, low birth weight in children and anemia in adolescent girls, pregnant women, lactating mothers as well as children. Rashtriya Poshan Mah is being celebrated during the month of September, 2021 to further accelerate various activities under Poshan Abhiyan and to create a Jan-Aandolan in the Process by adhering to COVID-19. Debate was conducted for the classes IX, X and XII on the topics that are congruent with today's needs of nutrition. Poor nutrition leads to people being more argumentative and aggressive; Newspapers Devoting Less Space to In-Depth Nutrition Reporting were the subject matters of the debate. Learners showed great vocabulary and speaking skills.



c) Weekly Tests and Periodic Tests

Objective-answer tests are constructed to require students to apply concepts and analyse the learning growth. To evaluate the learning process, the weekly test started for Class XI from 3rd September. The question papers were based on critical thinking and competency in MCQS format. These weekly tests help the learners enhance their grasping power and reduce the exam stress and anxiety. These marks will be added for the assessment of Periodic One. According to the academic calendar of the school, in the month of August from 7th September 2021 to 11th September 2021, periodic examination-2 of all subjects from class I to XII was completed. One week of time was also given to the students for systematic preparation of the examination. The exam was conducted on the basis of multiple-choice questions in Google Form. The subject-wise test scores of periodic one and two were announced online on 25th September. Learners seemed satisfied and were further motivated to surpass their achievements in the next examination.



d) International Olympiad Examination

With the right motivation from their educators, the learners contributed to the heritage of the school by bringing laurels to the school. Students confidently participated in the Science Olympiad Foundation (SOF) and bagged gold medals of distinction and excellence in all the subjects. Miss. Aarna National Science Olympiad (NSO) as well as Medal of Distinction in the International Mathematics Olympiad (IMO). She was also awarded the gold International Topper Medal in the International General Knowledge Olympiad (IGKO). Master Snithik Kapse and Master Sanskar Suneri were conferred with the Medal of Distinction in (IGKO). Miss. Radha Gaidhane and Miss. Paridhi Bokade achieved Gold Medal of Excellence in (IEO) and (NSO) respectively. Whereas, Master Yathansh Ragit and Master Sarthak Barai bagged Gold of Excellence in (IMO). The Medal of Distinction for (IMO) was secured by Miss. Avadhi Dadhe. The school applauds their hard work and congratulates them for their outstanding performance and commendable achievements. Chairman Shri. Harish Kothari felicitated all the prize winners and wished them great success ahead.

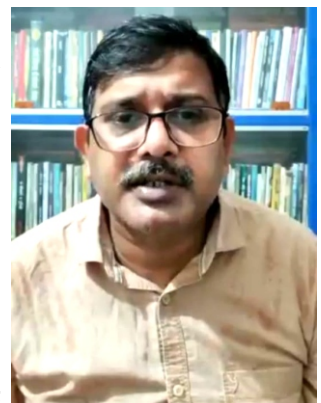

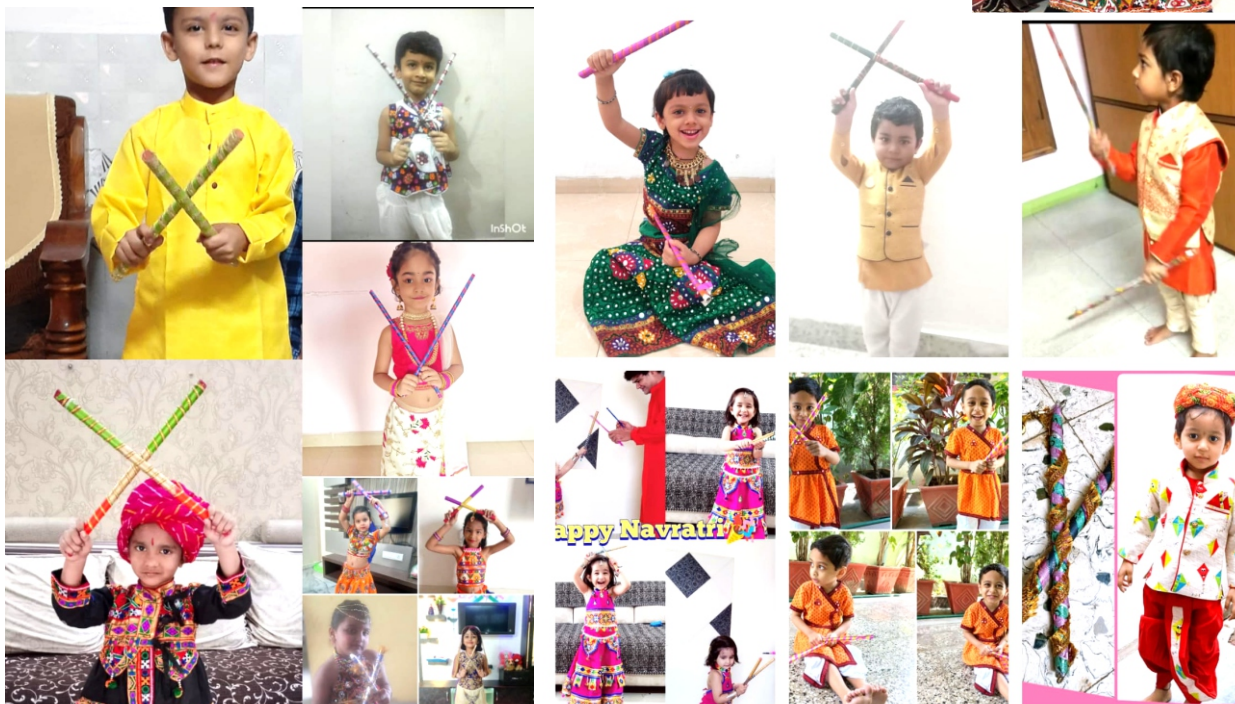

e) Logo and School Anthem Contest

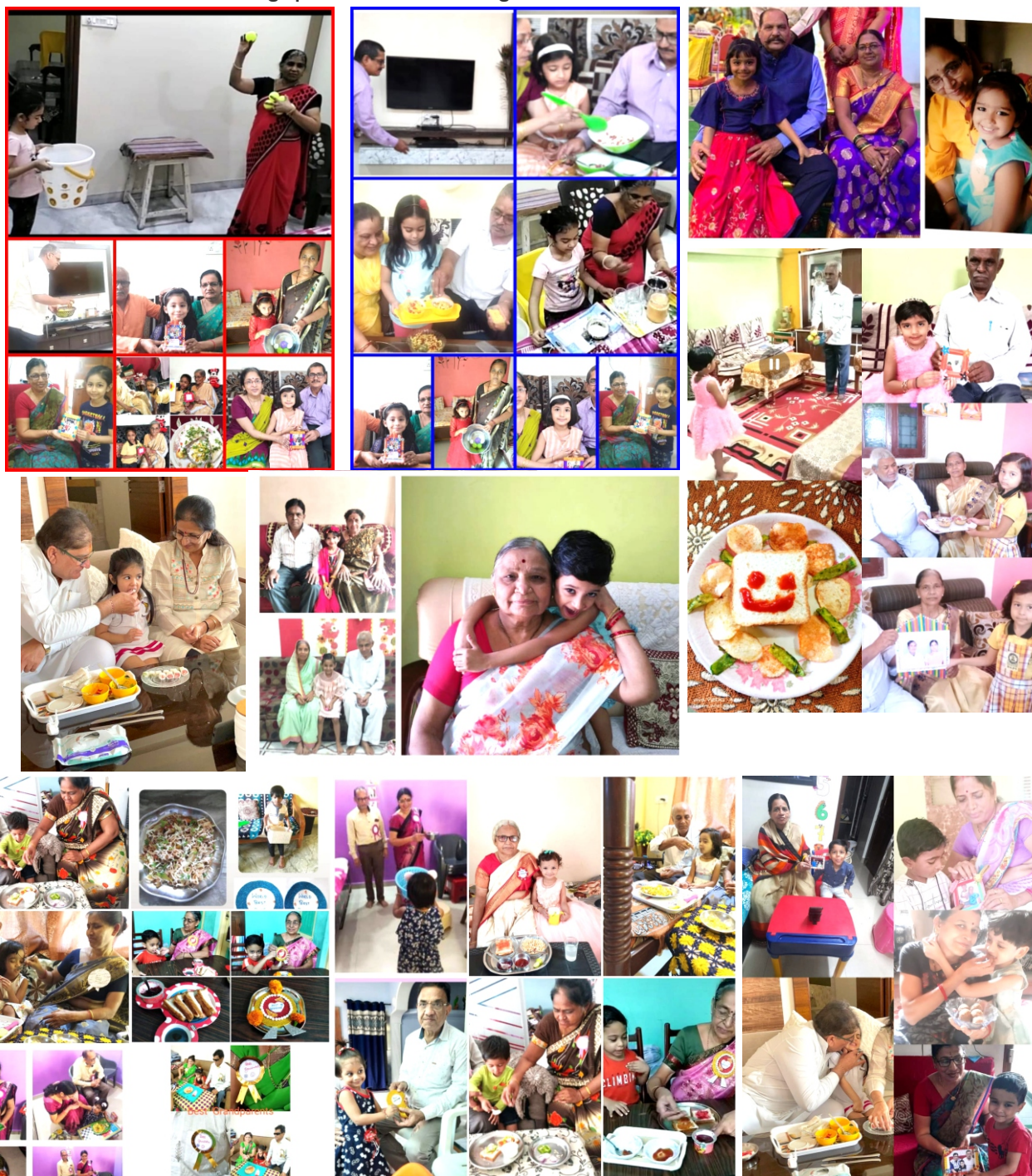

e) Seminar on Mental Health Awareness

The Swaminarayan School is inclined to enhance its educators' mental health and understand the importance of inner strength and sanity with prudence. The school organized a counselling session to spread awareness among its educators regarding the concept of mental and emotional being. Mrs. Prajakta Joshi, a renowned psychologist, addressed some of the major mental issues faced by individuals, especially during the lockdown such as Anxiety, Stress, Depression, Fear, Worry, Increased screen time, etc. She also discussed SNS (Sympathetic Nervous System) which involves the connection of mental and physical fitness. Mrs. Joshi elaborated about the effects of mental illness in the children resulting to disorders and explained how a teacher can contribute in creating a safe and secured atmosphere for the encouragement of the child. The educators were benefited and acknowledged the need for the same. The school took the initiative and spread the awareness regarding the mental health of the adolescents during the Mental Illness Awareness Week 2021. Counselling seminar was conducted for the parents and the students of classes VI to XII by the school counselors. The counselors shared information on how mental health is important and why it should be nurtured and preserved. They explained the fact that being mentally and emotionally healthy is as important as being physically fit and how it can strengthen the construction of a positive attitude and overall personality development. The counselors resolved their queries and helped them to tend to their mental health.



f) Swamiji's Discourse

In the presence of Pujya Divyavatsal Swami and Pujya Amrutsneh Swami, a debate on '**Brahmavidya Adhyayan**' was conducted to conclude that 'Dharma' i.e., the eternal root or the cosmic law behind right behaviour and social order. Team I supported the topic which was led by the Chairman of our school Shri. Harish Kothari and Team II stood against the topic of the debate which was led by the Academic Head Shri. Vishal Sawant and Administrative Head Shri. Vailesh Unnarkar. Both parties had equal and fair chances to prove their points. The underlying objective of the debate was to prove that the Vedas are the source of knowledge of medicine, music, deities, offerings, geography, mathematics, astronomy and universe.

This debate was a way to recall the divinity of Vedas and inculcate the lost culture in our character. A spiritual discourse on the theme of **self-introspection and acceptance** was experienced by The Swaminarayan fraternity. The discourse was addressed by Sadhu Munivatsaldas who has translated his own version of several great Indian epics like Mahabharata, Ram Charitra, Swaminarayan Charitra, etc. Sadhu Munivatsaldas talked about the necessity of quiet introspection and creating a feeling of mutual understanding among human beings. He elaborated the importance of moral values, self-realization, faith and the fundamental need of charity in an individuals' life which magnifies the feeling of compassion and gratitude.

A reflective discourse took place in the Swaminarayan premises on the subject; **Misunderstandings**. The discourse began with the introduction of the day's speaker, Shri. Jayeshbhai Mandanka by the administrative incharge of the school Shri. Vailesh Unnarkar. Shri. Jayeshbhai Mandanka is a recognized figure of the B.A.P.S. Sansthan. Being an Associate Professor of English as well as holding a doctorate, Jayeshbhai gave a profound lecture on the grave side-effects of human misunderstandings. He elucidated that the key to reduce misunderstandings is to increase mutual respect in the society. When we respect each other's views and opinions, there is no room for negative comprehension of one's ideas. It is essential to show courtesy and freedom. A single moment of mis-communication and misunderstanding is so poisonous that it makes us forget the positive moments. To steer clear of this, self-introspection is extremely crucial. Chairman Shri. Harish Kothari expressed his gratitude towards the guest speaker Shri. Jayeshbhai Mandanka.

g) Counselling Sessions

i) Growth Mindset (Pre-primary)

A growth mindset is the underlying belief that abilities can be developed through effort and practice. Children with a growth mindset persist in the face of challenges because they understand that effort and hard work can change ability and intelligence. During this session, the counsellors counselled the parents about the necessity of healthy diet for the growing age and also explained the importance of a healthy routine.

ii) Peer to Peer Learning (Primary)

Peer-to-peer learning is described as learning with and from each other in an informal and formal setting. It has been an integral part of a student's learning journey in the traditional educational set up. Every student learns from other students, and teachers learn different techniques from other teachers, through an exchange of ideas, participating in activities, working collaboratively and sharing feedback. The importance, advantages and the skills were explained to the students and parents.

iii) Academic Stress, Exam Anxiety and Depression (Secondary)

Childhood and adolescence are found to be a particularly sensitive period with regards to emotional and mental health. Amongst children and young people, evidence shows that depression and anxiety like experiences are increasing. Recent counselling session campaign was organized to encourage children and explain them the signs of exam anxiety and how to overcome them. Steps to overcome depression and time management techniques were explained to the students.

h) Counselling Workshop for Educators Behavioural management in classroom

Behaviour problems in a classroom increase the stress levels for both the teacher and pupil, disrupt the flow of lessons and create conflict with both learning objectives and the processes of learning. They also change the classroom dynamic as the focus of attention shifts from the academic tasks at hand to the distractions provided by disruptive behaviours. Typically, one or two pupils are identifiable as 'problems', sometimes they act in ways that compound management difficulties by inciting each other and, possibly, others in the class into disruptive activities. The usual response to problematic behaviour is to identify the children involved as 'the problem', to focus on them as a source of 'trouble' and to devise strategies specifically to deal with their inappropriate behaviour. What is the common behaviour? Which are the common behaviours, ABC of behaviours, why do we teach students, techniques of classroom management were the topics included in this counselling session.



i) Reward Ceremony for In-House Competition

c) Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Programme

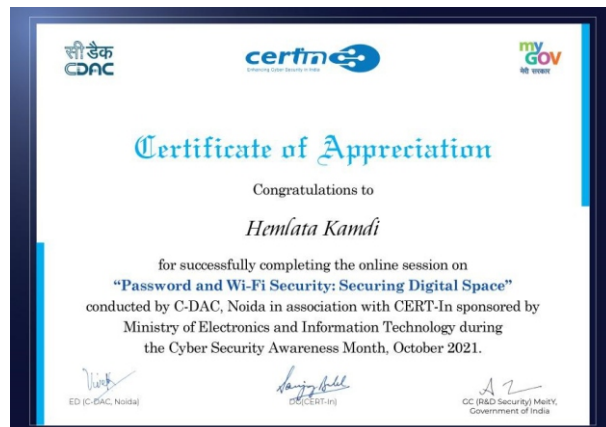

a) CBSE Training for Educators

To develop proficiency and introduce new methodology and teaching styles, the Central Board of Secondary Education conducts frequent and structured training sessions for educators. The training sessions are organised by various Centres of Excellence (COEs) who facilitate essentials and refresh the knowledge and make it crisp and practical.

b) Webinar Series on Competency Based Question Development

With the Circular released on 29 September 2021, CBSE invited teachers to webinars on **Competency-based Question Development** in detail for four main subjects - Science, Mathematics, Social Science and English. The panellists of each webinar covered how the questions are formed around the Learning Outcomes and follow the Competency-based Education System. There was a lot covered in these webinars, starting with the basic parameters that should be kept in mind to develop MCQs for the upcoming Term 1 Board exams.

- Cognitive complexity
- Content quality
- Meaningfulness
- Language appropriateness
- Transfer and generalizability
- Fairness
- Reliability

Essentially, each webinar had the same concept of Bloom's Taxonomy to help educators set their practice question papers and the same concepts of question development and analysis is applied on all the subjects of Classes X & XII. The panelists had busted a lot of myths regarding new MCQ types for Term 1 Board exams, which allow both learners and educators to stay on track of their preparation in accordance with the Competency-based MCQs.





c) In-House Training – Art and Craft workshop

To develop a healthy competition among the educators and to cultivate their interest in craft work, an Inter-House Craft workshop was held on the eve of Diwali. The Creative Department of the Swaminarayan School conducted an art and craft workshop for the educators to present new approaches for Diwali decoration. The art educators, Mrs. Darshana Parmar and Mr. Vikas Sharma demonstrated simpler and effortless decorative ideas such as easy Rangoli designs by using stencils, Diya Decoration, Flower and Lantern making. 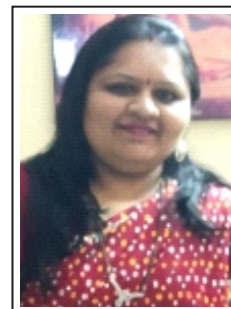

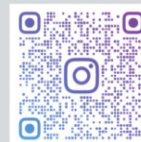
